FISH - Young but Growing

Ithaca FISH was born about a year ago in the Ithaca area when some church groups decided to form an organization of "good neighbors."

The ancient Greek word for "fish" is ichthus; and the letters for "ichthus" make a Greek monogram for "Jesus Christ, Son of God, Savior." The early Christians used the fish as a symbol for Christ; and this new ecumenical venture has taken it to itself.

FISH is now providing services to Ithaca area families on a 24-hour basis through an answering service which alerts a volunteer who is "on call" and

who then seeks to help those in need.

According to Mrs. Dean Linn-scott, parish representative of FISH at Immaculate Conception, most requests are for transportation, such as visits to the doctor for the elderly. Other frequent requests are for assistance in baby-setting, cooking, and shopping. Some seek just a bit of companionship or someone to read to the elderly, blind, or infirm.

As proof of the organization's usefulness, the number of requests has grown to 75 per month in only one year. With greater numbers have come requests broader in scope. Those that are received involving requests for emergency food or loans of money are handled in

conjunction with other local service organizations such as ACT and the Kitchen Cupboard.

If FISH can do nothing for the caller he is referred where possible to the proper local or state public agencies. Unfortunately, no long term arrangements for assistance can be accommodated.

FISH welcomes help, personal and otherwise; its members are all volunteers, and financial support is secured entirely by private or church donations.
