


Mass at the Aberdeen

Regional Divisions to Be Aired

All meetings will begin at 8 p.m. Laymen who miss the meeting in their own region may attend any other meeting.

Tentative plans for the governing structure in each region; and the financing of its own projects for solving its own problems, will follow the set-tling of which parishes are properly related by region to work out mutual issues gether, Father Shamon said.

Meeting the current school crisis is the immediate target of the regional planning. Each regional unit would decide on the manner of consolidation of schools where necessary, the coordination of all religious instruction programs and planning of adult education programs and teacher training in

In a short while, Father Shamon indicated, the supraparochial concept of cooperation through regionalism would help other phases of diocesan activity, such as the establishment of a diocesan pastoral council after parish boards are functioning, furthering of liturgical renewal and promotion of the Human Development Cam-

In each region pastors and parish boards would keep full autonomy and responsibility for matters purely parochial. Through representatives on the regional board of their area they would participate in discussion of all regional prob-lems and share the solution.

A unique feature of the Monroe County groupings, Father Shamon said, is "an out-reach program in each region which will involve voluntary interparish sponsorship of one or two inner city parishes." Each region also includes a major Catholic high school which will


