VIP, says the club works in two general ways. First, by personal visits and telephone visits, according to members' preference and assignment; second, by providing library, shopping, reading and writing services to persons who would find it difficult to do these things themselves.

Enthusiasm for the VIP has been so widespread at St. Ambrose that a Junior VIP has been organized, under the leadership of the adult group, for interested teenagers.

The club reports that 25 adults and 20 teeenagers are helping shut-ins.
