Bath School Changes Structure of Classes

Bath — St. Mary's School will inaugurate a pre-kindergarten school in September with registration open to all, regardless of religious affiliation.

The fourth through sixth grades will be discontinued and emphasis will be placed on education of the younger children. Two Sisters and two lay teachers will form the faculty for the school set up on a pre-kindergarten through Grade 3 basis.

The new type of school has the full approval of Father Daniel Brent, superintendent of schools for the diocese, and Sister Mary Agnes, supervisor of Catholic schools for the Southern Tier.

The plan drew unanimous support from the school's nine Board of Education members, headed by Karol Anders, chairman.

Registration dates will be announced soon.

Father James Marvin To 'Tramp for Trees'

Wayland — Similar to Project REACH's fund raiser, an ecumenical and community effort called "Tramp for Trees" has been planned by St. Joseph's Church for June 6.

Purpose is to beautify village streets with 100 new trees. Sponsors of that walk may also designate contributions to Project Hope or Project REACH.

Father James Marvin, pastor, has announced he will personally walk that day and said he has "picked up eight additional sponsors, including three Bishops, who together have pledged \$5.50 for each mile I successfully complete."

Father Marvin said he now has 19 sponsors and "is worth \$9.25 per mile, or \$92.50" if he goes the entire 10-mile route.
