RACL Signs Peace Treaty

The Rochester Association of Catholic Laymen (RACL) at its recent general membership meeting unanimously endorsed the "People's Peace Treaty" to end the war in Indochina.

This treaty was first set up by the National Student Organizations of the United States, North Vietnam and South Vietnam and has in recent months been signed by numerous persons and organizations throughout the United States and Indochina.

Provisions of the treaty seek an American pledge to immediate and total withdrawal from Vietnam, to set a date by which all American forces will have been removed, and to oust the government of Thieu-Ky-Khiem.

The Vietnamese pledge to enter discussions about the release of all American prisoners and the safety of all withdrawing troops, to form a provisional coalition, government to organize democratic elections and to guarantee the safety and political freedom of those South Vietnamese who have worked with the Ky government.

The Treaty also agrees to an immediate cease fire between U.S. forces and those led by the Provisional Revolutionary Gov-

ernment of South Vietnam, the release of all political prisoners and the independence, peace and neutrality of Laos and Cambodia.

In ratifying the agreement (RACL) also pledged to take appropriate action to implement the treaty and to insure its acceptance by the government of the United States.
