## Clergy Changes Listed by Diocese

Thirty parishes will be affected by changes and new appointments of clergy in the assignment list announced this week by Bishop Joseph L. Hogan. The appointments are effective on Thursday, June 24.

Father Charles R. Reynolds, after 43 years in the priesthood has retired from the triple-pastorate of churches in Leicester, Retsof and Piffard where he has served since 1940.

Two new pastors were named: Father Edwin R. Wedow to succeed Father Reynolds as pastor of St. Thomas Aquinas, Leicester, St. Lucy, Retsof, and St. Raphael, Piffard; and Father Frederick W. Bush as pastor of Holy Spirit, Penfield, succeeding Father Joseph W. Dailey.

Father Wedow has been assistant pastor at St. Francis De Sales, Geneva for four years. Father Bush has been assistant at Old St. Mary's, Rochester for four years.

Among eight special assignments made by Bishop Hogan were changes affecting the diocesan Office of Human Development, Becket Hall, Holy Sepulchre Cemetery and the diocesan mission parish in La Paz, Bolivia.

Father John Hempel moves from the Human Development Office to become rector of Becket Hall, the house of studies for seminarians at St. John Fisher College. Father Charles Mulligan, having finished studies at Cornell University, will succeed Father Hempel.
