Kearney Wins Math Honors

Tom Olejarski of Bishop Kearney High School won \$100 by beating 3,140 contestants in the 22nd annual High School mathematics competition.

Tom, a senior, scored highest in Monroe County and was fourth among the 3,144 who took part. With him on Kearney's team, which also was highest in the county, were Carolyn Wahl, a senior, and Richardo Juskiewicz, a junior. The school was rated fifth among the 263 upstate schools that entered the contest.

Sr. Lucile

Mass of the Resurrection for Sister Lucile Ryan of the Sisters of St. Joseph was offered in the Motherhouse Chapel, June 7.

Sister Lucile was a teacher in diocesan parochial schools for more than fifty years. She served 19 years at Corpus Christi, eight years at St. Aloysius, Auburn, and at Sacred Heart, Immaculate Conception, Ithaca, St. Patrick's Cathedral, St. Mary's, Waterloo, St. Casimir's, Elmira. After her last full-time teaching at St. Anne's, Palmyra, 1962-63, she was assigned to Sts. Peter and Paul, Elmira, where she gave part time assistance in the school.

She entered the Sisters of St. Joseph in 1908 from St. Mary's Parish, Auburn, and earned state teacher certification through the congregation's Normal School.

Surviving are a brother, John Ryan of Auburn, a niece and nephews from Auburn and Batavia.

Frank J. Gutberlet of Albe-Marle Street, an usher at Holy Rosary for 25 years, died May 23, 1971. The funeral was held May 26.
