Parishioners Get Chance To Speak Up in Owego

Owego — Parishioners at St. Patrick's Church here received their "chance to be heard" two weeks ago when, instead of the regular Sunday sermon, a three-page questionnaire was passed out to those in the congregation to be completed during the homily part of the Mass.

The innovative idea was conceived by the church's Liturgy

Committee whose job is to work with the parish priests to plan and implement the public worship program at the church.

Questions ranging from "Would you approve a decision by the Church allowing priests to marry?" to "Is the time schedule of Masses convenient to you?" were included.

The majority of the questions

were general but others pertained just to the activities of St. Patrick's.

Questions such as "Do you approve the use of Extraordinary Ministers in the distribution of Holy Communion?", "Do you think the priest should discuss in a Sunday sermon, topics such as, drugs, race prejudice, rioting: Vietnam War?".

topics such as, drugs, race prejudice, rioting; Vietnam War?", "Would you say your personal faith has been shaken by all the changes (the major changes in the celebration of the Mass in the past few years), and "Do you think the Catholic Church is more in tune with the modern world now than it was before Vatican II?" are just some of the generalized queries made in the report.

The parishioners were also asked whether they would want St. Patrick's School to continue to operate if financial and teaching situations stayed at present levels.

The first two sheets of the questionnaire could be filled out anonymously, while the final page called for the person's name, address and phone number.

The final page dealt with parish organizations and which ones a person would be interested in plus such questions as "Would you attend a Home Mass?", and "Do you have any particular talent or interest you would be willing to offer our parish?"

The results of the questionnaire will be compiled by the parish's liturgy Committee and Parish Council. The announcement of the results is not expected until late in August.
