
To serve in one parish for 35 years is unusual. Since his or dination in 1934, Father Nolan had one previous assignment, St. Mary's in Canandaigua, prior to his coming to Geneva as assistant to the late Msgr. William H. McPadden. In 1953, when Msgr. McPadden died, Father Nolan succeeded him as the third pastor of the parish.

Geneva-For the people of St. creased. In 1956 a new addition was constructed and the original sector modernized. During the 14 years Father Nolan served as principal, DeSales High School experienced continual growth.

One of his first projects was the organization of the St. Ste-phen's Club which became one of the best known social clubs in Geneva until the advent of World War II and the scattering of most members.

Father Nolan's interests ex-ceed parochial boundaries, Some of his community activities include the organization of a Newman Club at Hobart and Wil-liam Smith Colleges. In 1970, in recognition of his years of service to his church and com-munity, the colleges gave him an honorary degree.,
