Msgr. Roche, New Chairman, Sees Valid Role for PAR

Ithaca — Msgr. William M. Roche, pastor of St. Catherine of Siena, has been hamed chairman of the Priests' Association of Rochester for the coming year. He succeeds Father William Donnelly.

Since its formation a few years ago by diocesan priests in search of a vehicle for expressing their collective ideas on social, ministerial, and diocesan administrative matters, the PAR has dwindled to where it now numbers only about 50

sioned for the association have been assumed by the subsequently formed Diocesan Priests Council. But Msgr Roche said he believes that an organization that continues to represent 12 to 15 per cent of the priests in the diocese can fulfill a role independent of the Priests Council.

In a recent interview, he spoke about three possible ways in which the PAR can serve both its membership and the other priests in the diocese.

"A priest's personal life to-day is changing rapidly," he said, " along with the nature of his ministry and his parish or other mission.

"The mandated formation of parish councils places the pastor and co-pastor in a new, and for many, an uncertain role. The vague future of Catholic education, the new demands placed upon the priest by a vernacular liturgy, and the role of priests in society are all chang-

Priests themselves must have a-major voice in determining what direction they will take in their life and work, and the PAR can assist in this determination, the new president observed.

He noted the emphasis on continuing education evident in the careers of men in business and professional life, and stated that a similar need exists in the life of a priest.

Priests must be knowledgeable on the issues of the day, particularly those with moral or social significance, he empha-

sized. However, they should not be limited to these matters. They must likewise be familiar with new and more efficient methods of operating their parishes, schools, and other insti-tutions. Monsignor Roche pe-lieves the PAR can play a prominent role in scheduling, organizing, and determining the subject matter for seminars and workshops designed to achieve this goal of continuing priestly

He said the PAR could and should represent a particular point of view on social and ministerial issues. A group representing 12-15 percent of the diocese's priests is substantial enough in size that it should be heard, he feels, and it will provide another thoughtful viewpoint for discussion whethers others share the view or not.
