The plan will reach final realization July 17 and 18 when a Carmelite Fun-D Days celebration will be held on the monastery's grounds.

Feast day Masses in honor of Our Lady of Mt. Carmel are scheduled for 10 a.m. both days.

More than 30 booths will be manned by various organizations and groups with proceeds going to the Carmelite Order.

Food and games will be available at the Fun-D Days. Transportation services also will be provided with a special bus leaving Waverly every hour that the Fun-D Days are held.

Construction of the monastery began in 1958 on 93 acres

donated by Edwin O'Brien and his brother, the late William O'Brien.

The monastery was dedicated on Sept. 8, 1962, after being constructed for more than \$750,000.

Currently the monastery houses six priests, two brothers and two men studying for the priesthood.

From current projections it is believed that the Fun-D Days will substantially reduce the remaining debt on the monastery's construction.

Thus part of the problem Father Cyril Guise, superior, and Father James Hushek presented to the 17 lay people may be alleviated within a few short days.
