Since the beginning of the center in 1968, Father Weider has served as an active member of its executive council. He has also served as a consultant for the State Bureau of Migrant Education, Bureau of Vocational Education at Alfred State University, and the American Red Cross. He is a founding member of the Bureau of Program Funding in Geneseo. He began fulltime work at the center last month.

REACH, he helped organize a rural housing development for migrants as a member of the Rural Housing Alliance; a rural health program, migrant child development center, educational task force and rural committee.

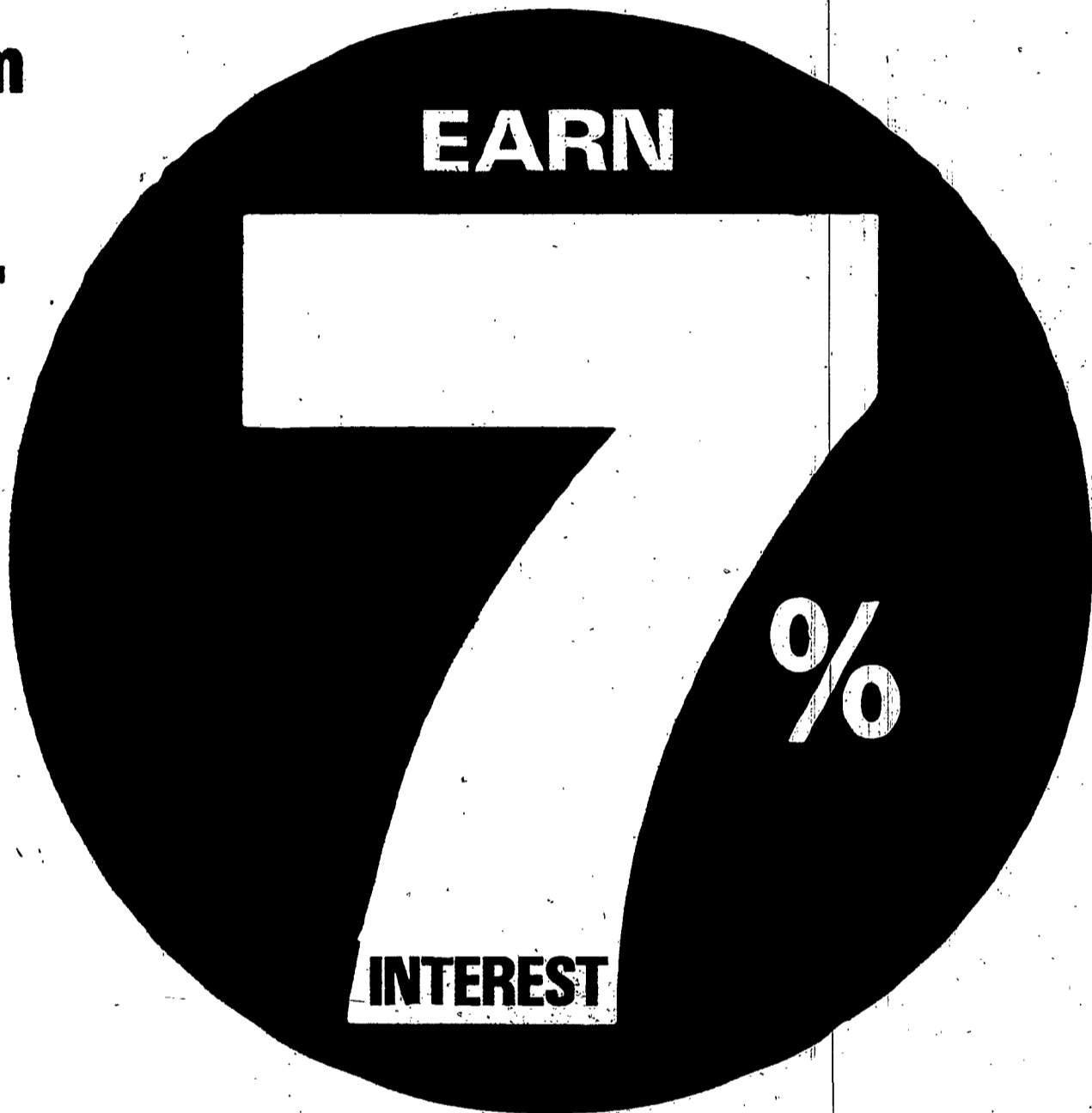
The group will compete in Mt. Morris, July 17; in Hornell, July 23; in Dansville, July 24;
