I must have been in high school when some savant among my classmates pointed out that any time I was questioned as to the authorship of one or another well-known sayings my reply should be "Benjamin Franklin."

I would, said my tutor, be correct at least 75 per cent of the time. For such, he instructed, were the qualities of the man.

I was reminded of this last week while reading a condensed version of Franklin's "Autobiography." Much of whatever I had read about this great American I had forgotten and it tickled me anew to read that he was the 15th of 17 children. (Not too long ago a psychiatrist favoring strict birth control measures for the world claimed that where there more than two children in a family, the kids aren't likely to amount to much.)

Franklin, with only a year of formal schooling, taught himself everything he knew in science, philosophy, languages and as a statesman.

His "Poor Richard's Almanack" was the first publishing success in America. He started it at 26. At 78 he invented bifocals.

In between he discovered electricity, identifying the pos-

itive and negative concepts, started the first circulating library, invented the Franklin stove, was responsible for inventing the dual system of state governments united under a federal authority, engineered the Senate-House compromise plan to satisfy both small states which wanted equal representation and big states which wanted representation according to population.

There is more, but what I find most interesting are all the philosophical gems he left us.

Here are a few:

- Remember that time is money.
- God helps them that help themselves.
- Early to bed and early to rise, makes a man healthy, wealthy and wise.
- Little strokes fell great oaks.
- He that goes a borrowing, goes a sorrowing.
- A word to the wise is enough, and many words won't fill a bushel.
- We must all hang together, or assuredly we shall all hang separately.
- Here Skugg lies snug as a bug in a rug.
