"My father," she said, "spent one year in Austria where I went to school without any difficulties regarding the language. I dominate the Spanish and German language and speak English well."

tences. I also took part in athletics where I won several honors. I like all kinds of music and play the piano. I love to be among people and prefer to do things with a group," she wrote.

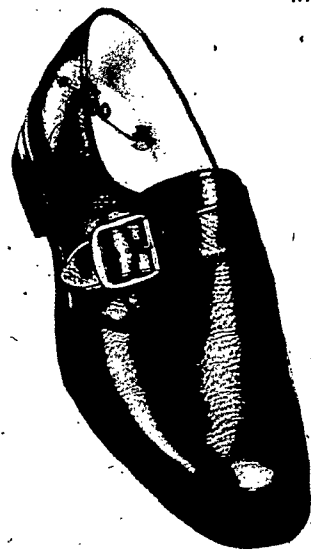

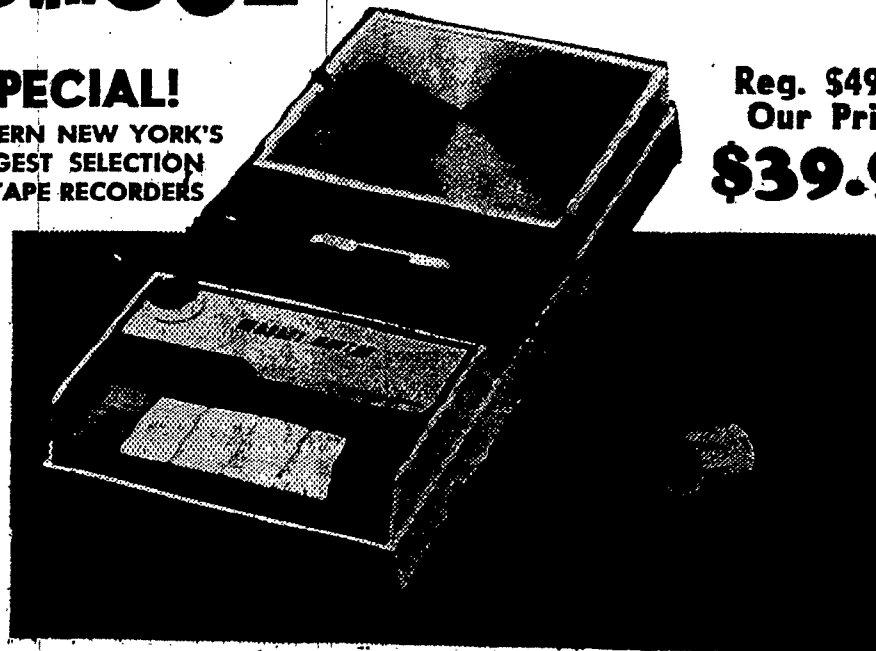
