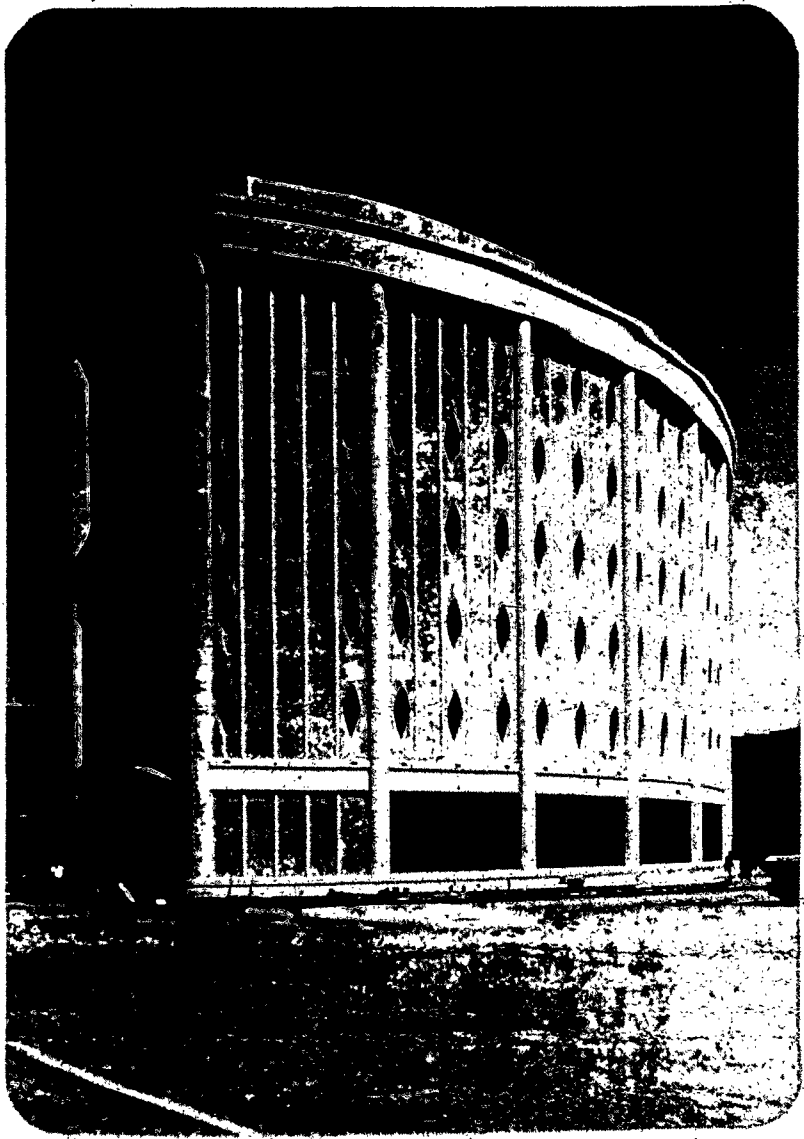
Elmira Area Notes
