lity is in question the decision is made on the local level, subject to appeals to the Archdiocese of New York Court of Second Instance, or to the Rota in Rome, the Supreme Court of the Church for marriage cases.

"In some cases state law may say you are not free to marry where the Church may say you are. We have completely different fields of competence. The tribunal, however, will never issue a decree of nullity unless the civil freedom is also there."

Msgr. Krieg pointed out that there has been a change of procedural laws as of a year ago, that requires fewer of the less important steps to the procedure. "But," he qualified, "this doesn't have an immediate effect on individual cases. The procedural rules are the tools given to you, but that doesn't say an individual case follows any pat time schedule.

"Essentially, in formal cases we gather enough material to provide a psychiatrist and

Pollution Essay Draws Plaudit From President

President Richard Nixon recently congratulated and thanked John Monaco for his interest in the nation's affairs.

Monaco is the son of Mr. and Mrs. Louis Monaco of 198 Lincoln St. and a June graduate of Holy Redeemer School.

At graduation exercises June 23, he was awarded a certificate of honor and a \$300 check toward his education from the Catholic War Veterans for an essay dealing with ecology and his ideas on solving the pollution dilemma.

President Nixon's letter of July 26 reads as follows:

"Recently I had the pleasure of reading your prize-winning essay on pollution. It is heartening to note your understanding of this complex problem and to see the effective plans for combating pollution which you propose. I hope you will continue your interest in helping to improve the quality of our environment, and this note comes to you with my very best wishes for the years ahead."

"I was pretty excited when I got it," Monaco admitted. "I wasn't expecting it. The Catholic War Veterans sent it. I also received a letter from Governor Rockefeller and Mayor May."

When asked what his plan for fighting pollution was he said: "It included a lot, but mainly I said that industry should carry the burden of cleaning up our pollution."

Monaco also received a partial scholarship to Aquinas Institute where he is now a member of the soccer team.

judges with sufficiently detailed personality profiles to permit a sensible decision."

He feels that the whole problem with marriages stems from the fact that people are giving nothing but the most cursory nod to spiritual and personal relationships these days, and, in our country, to marriage relationships. "Maybe if we gave more than lip service to our bonds we would have more stable relationships."

For this reason, he feels "The Church tribunal is more necessary than ever because people's attitudes toward marriage are so susceptible to change. The high divorce rate in this country is an obvious indication of a lesser regard for marriage as a permanent state of life. The psychological illness of many children can be traced back in so many instances to an unstable relationship between their parents. One of the roles of the tribunal is to attempt to keep a dynamic stability in such cases."

Msgr. Krieg described the function of the officials. He is the presiding judge and can appoint different officers for individual cases. There are some officers who are appointed in a technically official, more permanent capacity. These are associate judges; two of whom are chosen by turns to assist in making decisions in formal cases. Another is the defender of the bond, whose position is akin to a district attorney's in civil courts; he points out weaknesses in the proposed arguments against the marriage bond.

A third permanent position is the notary. Recently it has become possible for women to serve in this position. The Chancellor is the first notary of the diocese, he gives credence to all documents and they are not official without it.
