I was talking to a woman recently and confided that, yes, in spite of all the yelling I do regarding our three youngsters I would like another child.

"Ah, yes," she smiled knowingly, "some women just can't bear to be without a baby." And she nodded her head in the direction of our youngest, who at 20 months has only a vestige left of her baby ways.

I shook my head violently to indicate that those were not my feelings. She looked at me doubtfully.

After all, it is natural for a woman to love and want to care for helpless creatures. Or so we have been told.

When a man finds a new born baby placed in his arms and looks askance, it is considered a laughing matter. If a woman is afraid of such complete dependence upon her she is thought to be unnatural.

And that, I am afraid, includes me. Two of our children are adopted. Both were several months old when they first came to us. There may have been a tiny pang or two for missing out on those first few months of their lives.

But, it was more than balanced by an overwhelming relief that we had missed that first frightening adjustment period when babies tend toward colic, constant crying and overall misery.

I know other people who are nuts about babies and are often

heard to express the fervent wish that the infant could stay an infant and not have to grow up to be a grubby little kid.

I prefer grubby little kids. Oh, I'm as crazy about a sweet smelling, freshly dressed infant straight from the bath and powder amenities as the next mother.

And, how sweet it is to hold a baby in your arms and feel the tiny head on your breast, the even breathing of his sleep.

But, it is not so sweet when they take to crying piteously and they cannot tell you where it hurts.

The loss of physical closeness between mother and baby as the youngster starts reaching for independence is sometimes a poignant one.

But the mental relation possible between a mother and even a three-year-old can bring a joy that surmounts the physical one tenfold.

And, when the six-year-old takes time out from her grown up ways to dump herself in my lap and throw her arms around my neck, I find it infinitely more special than when she was a month old and knew me only by smell and touch and sound.

Growing up adds another dimension to the relationship between parent and child and while I sometimes wish I could slow up the process ever so slightly, I would not stop it for the world.
