

Deaf Theatre Scheduled

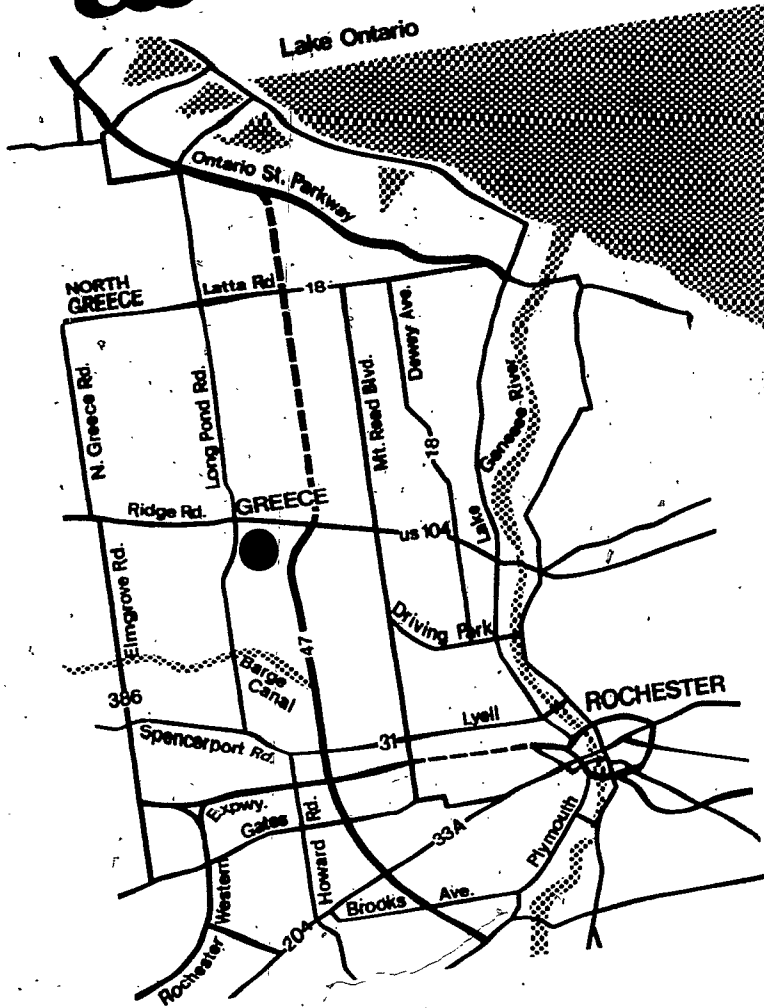
The National Theatre of the Deaf will begin its ninth national tour Sept. 30 and Oct. 1-2 on the campus of Rochester Institute of Technology, home of the National Technological Institute for the Deaf.

The National Theatre of the Deaf was launched by the Eugene O'Neill Theatre in Water-

ford, Conn., in the summer of 1967. It is composed primarily of deaf actors who perform in mime, dance and manual language with spoken narration for the hearing audience.

Local Problems Seen As Spur to Organization

Geneva — Discovery of practical goals for immediate inter-parish action is the way to put life into the regional formation of parish councils, diocesan department heads told the Formation Committee of the future Diocesan Pastoral Council at a plenary meeting here last week.

"Another structure will not excite the parishes," Father Daniel Brent, superintendent of schools said, "but encouraging priests and people to see pressing problems in their own area which local leadership should attack will get parish and regional councils moving."

Auxiliary Bishop John E. McCafferty, director of planning for the future Diocesan Pastoral Council, convened the meeting of his 15-member committee to hear suggestions from diocesan aides on how to gen-

erate "spirit" in the forming of parish councils where they do not exist and how to quicken the eventual coalescing of parochial groups into regional councils.

Presenting the liturgical needs of the diocese was Msgr. William Shannon. Ecumenical problems were reported by Msgr. Charles V. Boyle; social issues by Father Charles Muligan; educational concerns by Fathers Albert J. Shamon, Daniel Brent, Daniel Holland; the campus ministry by Father Gerald Appleby.

Bishop McCafferty announced that the formation committee was preparing recommendations for "a year of action" to stimulate parish councils and fulfill the regional plan for parish groupings. This would be followed by a year of preparing for a diocesan synod, he said.
