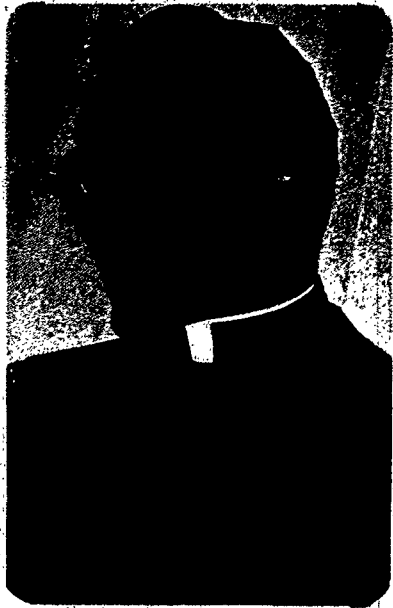

Three Pastorates Filled

Three pastorates were filled, the retirements of two other pastors from parochial administration were accepted and three priests were given special assignments in appointments announced today by Bishop Joseph L. Hogan.

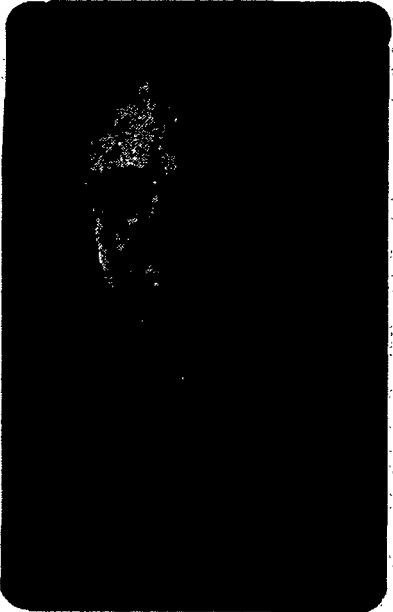
All appointments become effective, Wednesday, Oct. 6.

Father Richard Tormey, executive editor of the Courier-Journal, was named pastor of St. Stephen's parish in Geneva, vacated by the death of Rev. Raymond P. Nolan, Sept. 7.

Father James J. Marvin, pastor of St. Joseph's parish, Wayland, is to be pastor of St. Ambrose Church, Rochester, succeeding Msgr. Arthur J. Ratigan who has voluntarily resigned from administrative duties as a pastor and will be reassigned to other parochial work in November. Msgr. Ratigan has been pastor of St. Ambrose since August, 1963.

Father William J. Reifer, chaplain of St. Joseph's Infirmary at the Nazareth Motherhouse, Pittsford, will become pastor of St. Joseph's, Wayland.

In a shift involving St. Patrick's parish, Rochester, Father Frederick L. Walz will give up the pastorate and become chaplain at the St. Joseph Infirmary while Father Charles

Bennett, now pastor of neighboring St. Anthony's parish will become administrator of St. Patrick's as well.

The diocesan Spanish Apostolate will receive a new director in Father John D. Dillon, succeeding Father Anthony Calimeri. Father Dillon, who has been assistant pastor at St. Mary of the Lake parish, Watkins Glen, will work in St. Patrick's parish, Rochester.

Father Louis J. Hohman, formerly rector of Becket Hall, will become episcopal advisor to the Courier-Journal, and will be assistant pastor of St. Vincent De Paul parish, Churchville.

Father Edward E. Steinkirchner, pastor of Holy Ghost parish, Coldwater, will be Director of the diocesan Deacon Internship program, supervising the parochial work of deacons during the year between the end of their St. Bernard's studies and their ordination as priests.

Father Tormey, editor of the Courier-Journal since February 1968, was ordained in 1942. He has served brief appointments

as assistant pastor at St. Mary's, Auburn, and Our Lady of Lourdes, Rochester, was chaplain at Our Lady of Mercy High School and Motherhouse during 1951-60 and then chaplain to the Catholic community at Cornell University 1960-68.

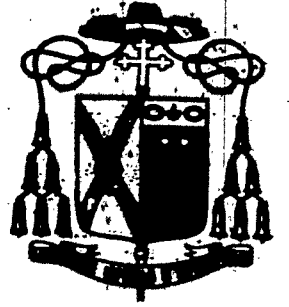
He was previously an associate editor of the Courier-Journal during 1947-51, after two years as a Navy chaplain in the Pacific theater.

Father Marvin, ordained in 1948, has been pastor at St. Joseph's, Wayland since Nov., 1967, after serving as assistant at Sacred Heart Cathedral, St. Andrew's and Holy Rosary parishes in Rochester. He is a member of the diocesan Priests' Council.

Father Reifer, goes to Wayland after a long career, as teacher at St. Andrew's Seminary, 1944-64, and pastorates in St. Theresa's, Stanley, St. Mary's, Rushville and St. Francis Church, Phelps. He was ordained in 1943. He retired from the Phelps parish for reasons of health in 1970 and was asked to be chaplain of the infirmary of the Sisters of St. Joseph.
