

Sister Cited for Generosity

Corning—Sister Mary Adolphine of the Sisters of Mercy was saluted recently by Father Thomas F. Brennan, pastor of St. Mary's Church here, for her "prompt generosity in helping us over a difficult time."

Father Brennan said that in February 1970 St. Mary's School faced a serious problem when two members of the faculty left at the end of the first semester.

There was little time to find a replacement for the "two key positions, and on very short notice Sister Mary Adolphine, who had already spent two different periods of her religious life in St. Mary's School, one as principal, returned to St. Mary's."

Sister Adolphine had been working at St. James Hospital in Hornell. She is now back at the hospital involved in her former responsibilities.

Corning Area School Board In Business

The board came into existence after the merger of Catholic elementary schools in the Corning area into two schools.

Others from the same parishes also serve on the school board. Members from St. Mary's, chosen recently, are Louis Ferraro, Jr. and Joseph Sweet, alternate.

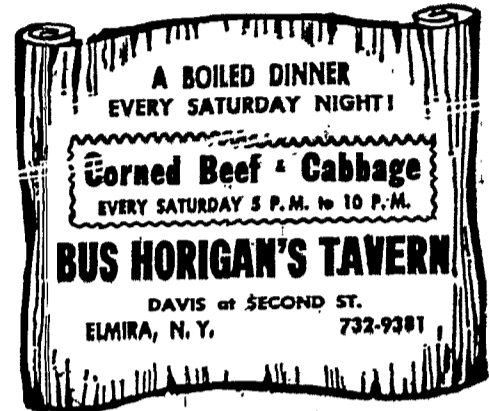

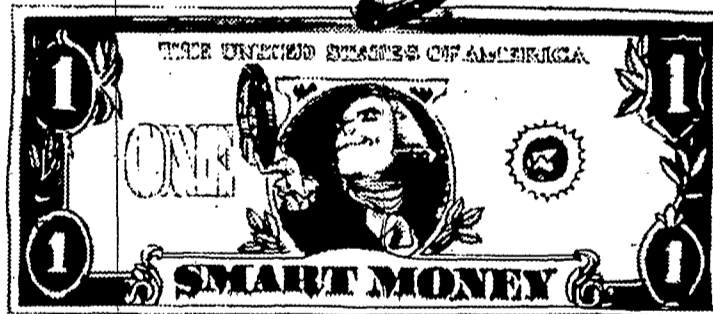
