Legion of Mary Celebrates 50th

About 425 members of the Legion of Mary from this diocese gathered recently at Notre Dame Retreat House in Canandaigua to celebrate the legion's 50th anniversary.

Auxiliary Bishop John E. McCafferty and the spiritual directors of five curiae offered Mass Sept. 19 as part of a worldwide jubilee.

The legion was founded in Dublin on the eve of the Feast of the Nativity of the Blessed Virgin, Sept. 7, 1921. Its purpose is described as "personal sanctification through apostolic action."

Father Benedict Ehmman of St. Michael's, Rochester, gave the homily. Concelebrants included Father William A. Trott, for the Rochester Comitium, and Fathers Bruce F. Ammering, Monroe Curia; Raymond J. Wahl, Auburn; Bartholomew J. O'Brien, Southern Tier, and Thomas H. Wheeland, Junior Curia.

Veterans Day Mass At Old St. Mary's

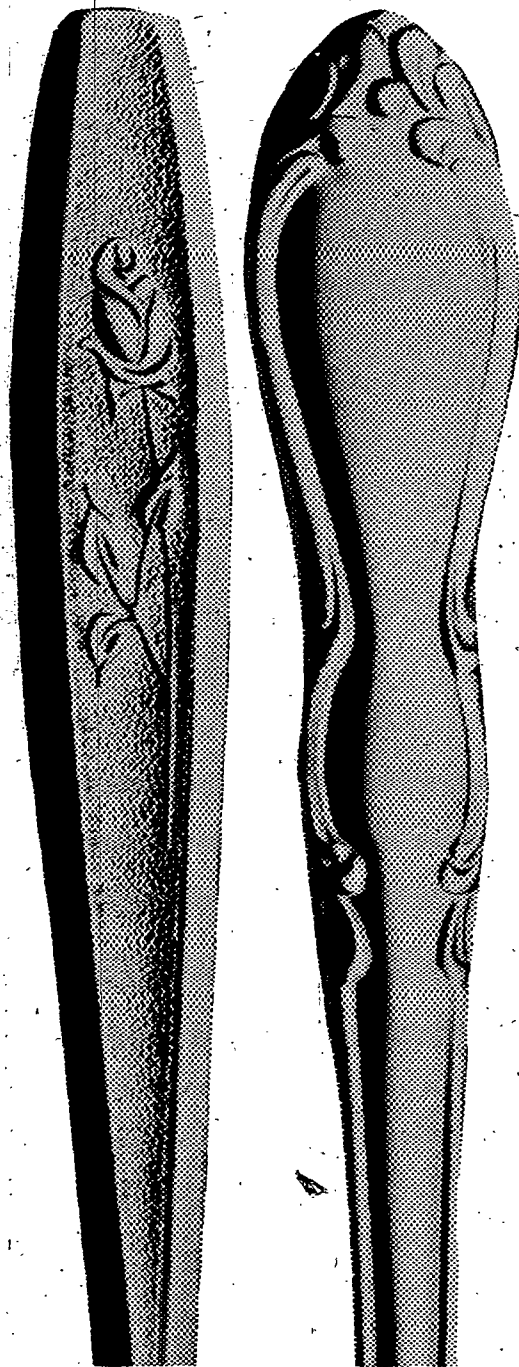
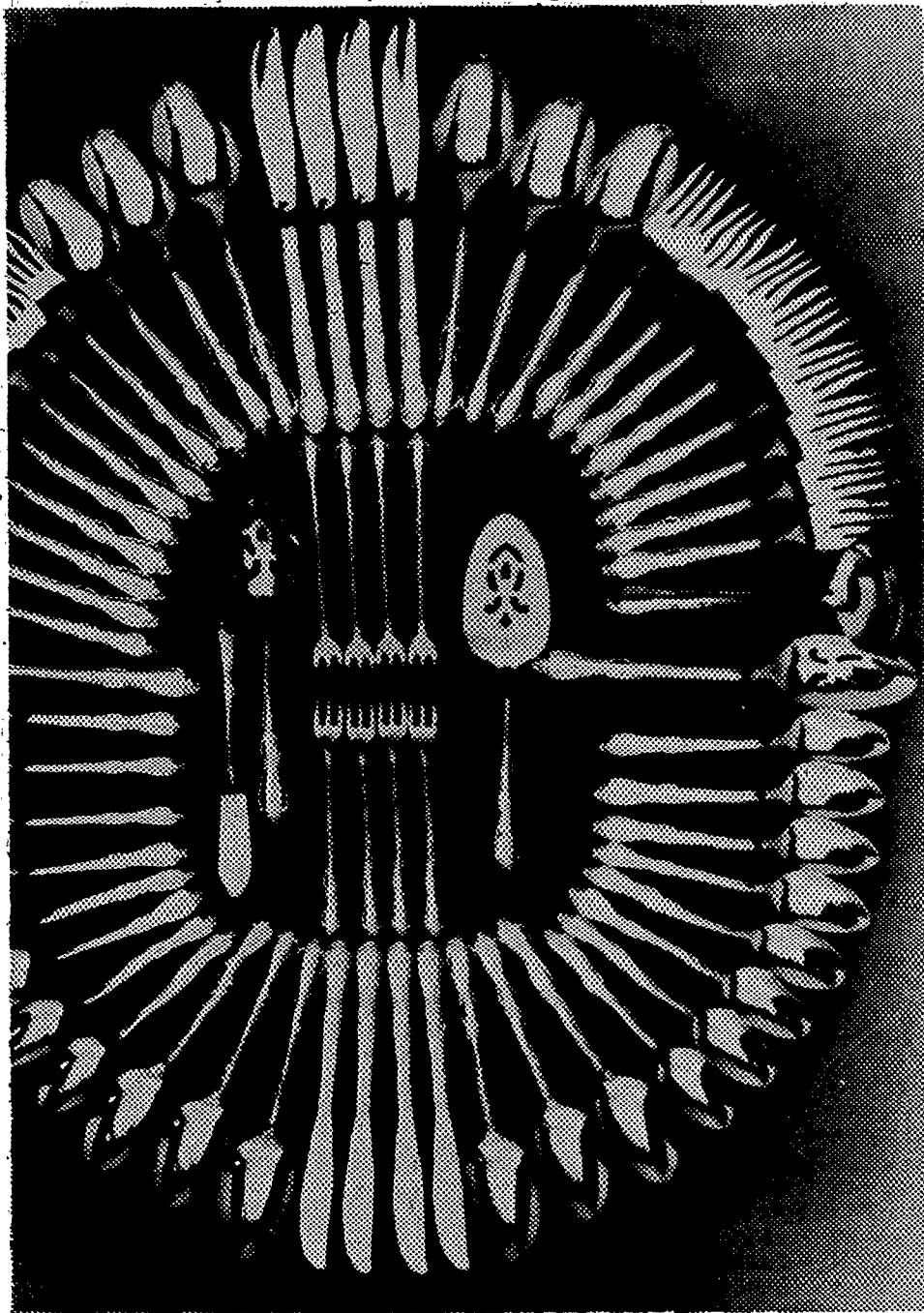
A mass in honor of men fallen in battle will be celebrated at 9 a.m. Monday, Oct. 25, in St. Mary's Church, downtown.

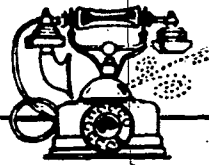
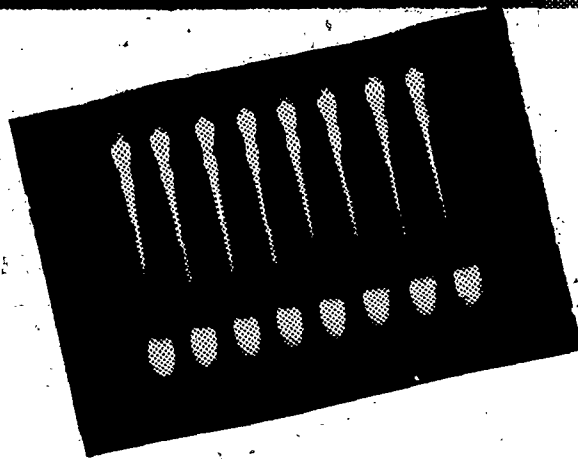
