The testimonial dinner which was held in the school auditorium, was attended by many of

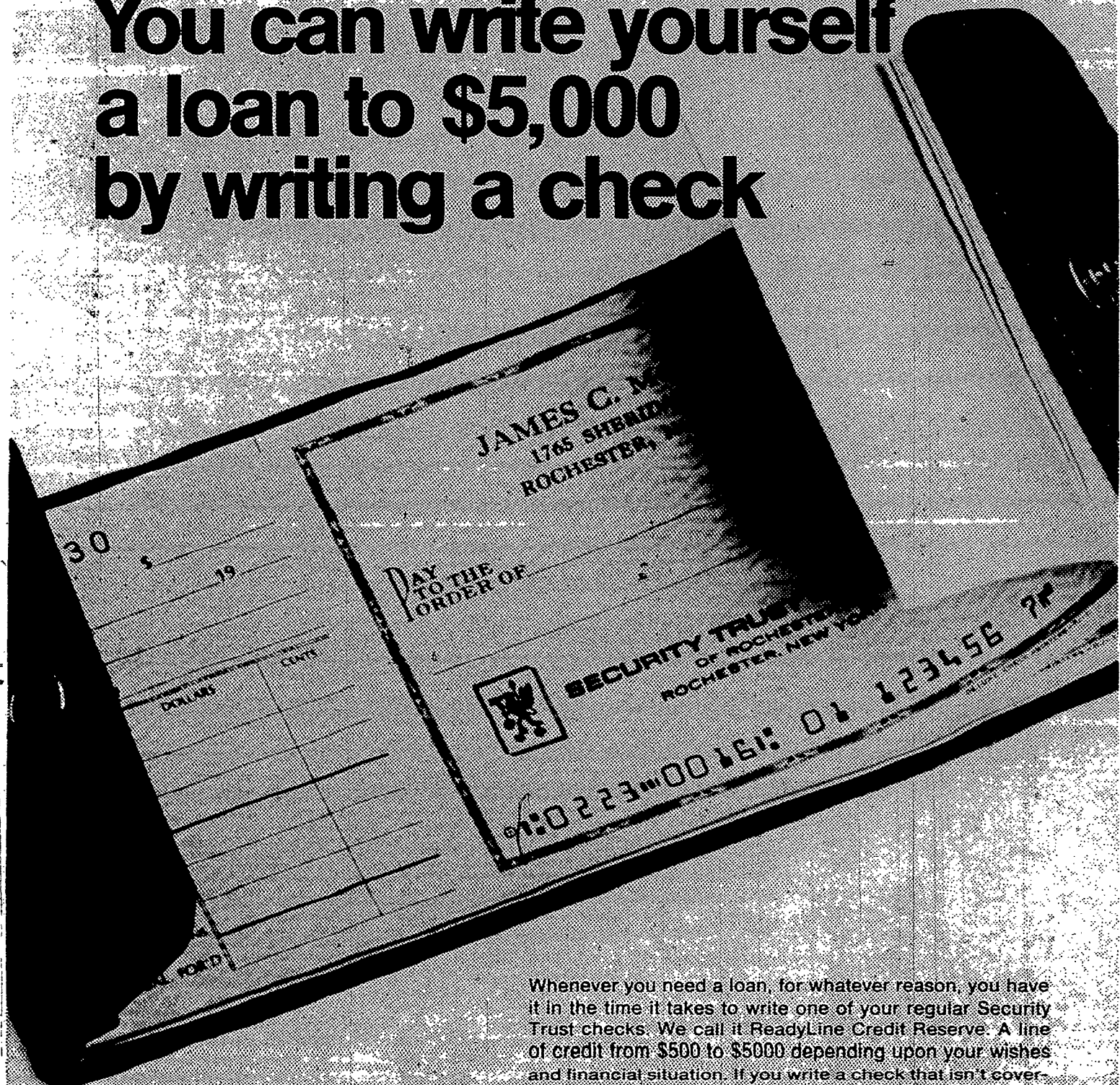
