About 1,500 migrant agricultural workers have arrived to join in the harvest in northern Steuben County.

While the workers are in the field each day, their children attend nearby schools or journey to one of the day care centers in the area.

"Day Care in Perkinsville is in its fourth year at Project REACH, Inc.", Mrs. Ruth Brown, REACH educational specialist said. "We have a highly qualified staff this year to serve our 50 enrollees."

The Perkinsville Day Care for migrant children is being directed by Miss Bernadette Guzzardo, formerly of Utica. The children have been divided into two groups: infants and pre-schoolers. According to Miss Guzzardo, ten of the enrolled children are Algonquin Indians whose parents are laborers at the Bennett and Saxby Fur Farms in Bloomfield. There are ten migrant camps in the Wayland-Dansville-Springwater area using the day care center facility in Perkinsville.

Attendance has averaged 20 children per day during September, and an increase is expected as the potato harvest becomes more intense. The children's daily routine begins with breakfast after 7 a.m. arrival, Formal instruction, art projects, table activities and rhythmic exercises fill the schedule.




