Life could begin at 40 for four area artists who are exhibiting their work for the first time at the Nazareth College Arts Center Nov. 8-26.

The men decided a few months ago to put on public display the best of the drawings, paintings, prints and sculptures they had been working on for many years in their spare time. The result is the forthcoming Nazareth exhibition, "Quaternary."

The artists are Harry D. Hicks, 41, of Rochester; John T. S. White, 44, Big Flats; Richard Roberts, 38, Fairport; and Charles Cary, 40, Dansville. All studied at Rochester Institute of Technology among other places.

Hicks, an art teacher at Brighton High School, starts his paintings with collage, then progresses to a search for and pulling out of figures. His relief sculpture is done by clay casting.

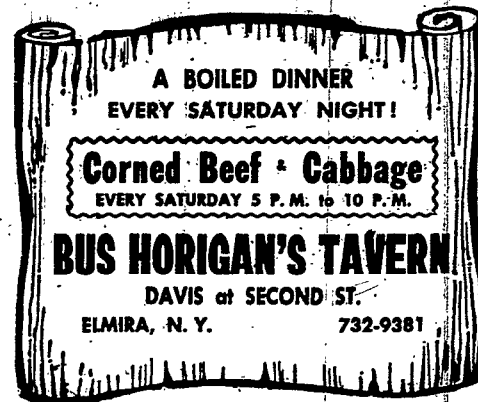
