### Boston Paper Cuts X Films

**Boston** — (RNS)—The Boston Herald-Traveler has announced it will stop publishing ads for X-rated movies and will not list such films in its theater timetable.

With rare exceptions, the X-rated movies have proved to be without "any genuinely redeeming artistic merit or social values," the newspaper said in a lead editorial.

"It is our judgment," the Herald-Traveler said, "that the vast majority of films rated 'X' by the Motion Picture Association of America are purely voyeuristic, exploitation movies which pander to every conceivable perversion."

Rochester, Regional Committee of the Southern Vicariate, was conducted by Father Robert F. McNamara, diocesan historian.

Father McNamara spoke about renovation of church sanctuaries and churches. The program was not a Christian art lecture, but an exposition of the guidelines concerning what can be done and is being done to renovate churches so that they are beautiful, yet functional, for carrying out of the liturgy.

Father McNamara, the author of historical books, also spoke on theological principles used in the allocation of space for worship. The author of "Century of Grace, History of St. Mary's Parish" and "History of North American College, Rome", Father McNamara also explained the types of architecture that are being used in building today's churches.

A native of Corning, Father McNamara will become a visiting professor at the Toronto School of Theology in 1972. He is a member of the board of directors of the Liturgical Arts Society, Inc., and chairman of the Church Art and Architecture, Liturgy Committee of the Diocese of Rochester.

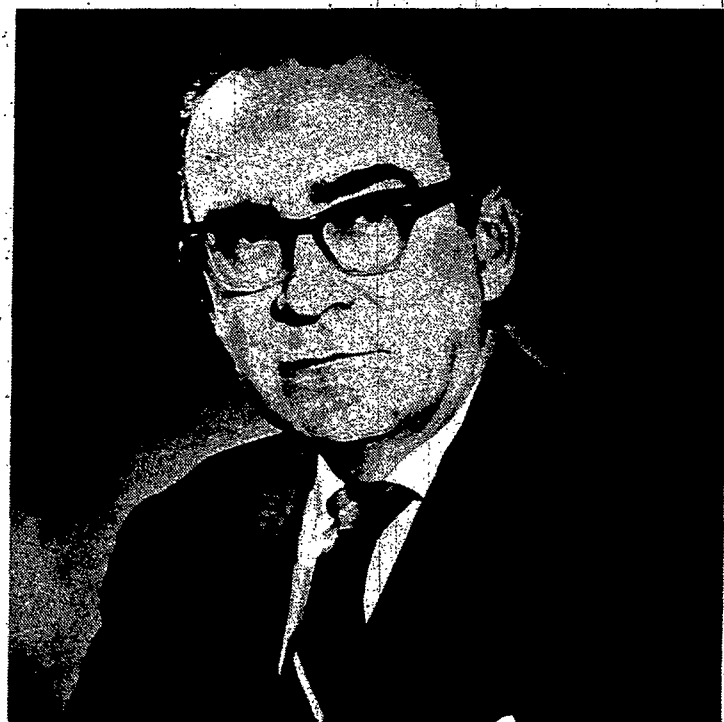
