The award, which is given to a hospital employe for friendly and outstanding service to mankind through service to the hospital, was presented to Mrs. Savino by Family Court Judge Daniel J. Donahoe, a member of the hospital's board of directors.

Mrs. Savino, who lives in Elmira, was cited for her "genuine concern for the job, the patients and the hospital."

"Her method of serving all with whom she comes in contact in a sensitive manner and always being concerned about doing the right thing and following through" are some of the reasons given for her selection as the third recipient of the coveted award.

A graduate of St. Joseph's Hospital School of Nursing in 1947, Mrs. Savino worked at the hospital for one year after her graduation and then moved to do general duty work at Millard Fillmore and Deaconess Hospital in Buffalo.

She returned to Elmira in 1949 and re-entered the local nursing field by working in a physician's office, being an industrial nurse at a local manufacturing plant and finally rejoining St. Joseph's Hospital staff where today she is employed in the Employee Health Service of the hospital.
