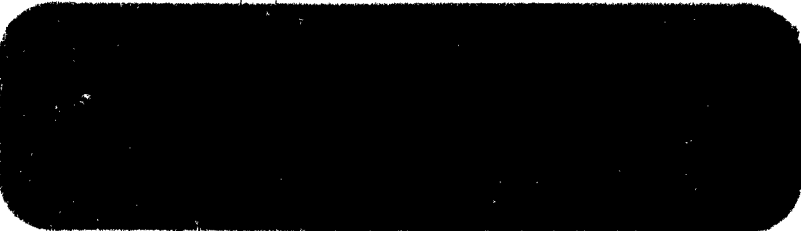
### Mrs. Cowen
