How 'Tramp for Trees' Bolstered HOPE

Wayland - The national HOPE organization has acknowledged this area's gift of \$700 and detailed the uses to which the money might be put.

The thank-you letter was addressed to Father James Marvin, former pastor of St. Joseph's who organized the Tramp for Trees that also raised HOPE funds.

The local contribution, the letter said, "is more than sufficient for Project HOPE to provide a ten-month residency or internship aboard the S.S.

HOPE, for a physician resident of a host country; or if used to support our immunization program, it can provide lifetime immunization against polio, whooping cough and diphtheria for 14,000 youngsters.

"In the developing nations, where Project HOPE conducts its medical education programs, a child has a 50-50 chance of living to see his fifth birthday. Therefore, the Wayland Tramp for Trees has provided the gift of life for many children. We deeply appreciate your support."

The rest of the cast comprises John Fiorito, award-winning baritone, as Marcello, the painter; Kerry McDevitt, Eastman School of Music graduate who scored sensationally in "Tosca" at Highland Park last summer and well known to Rochester audiences, as Schnaunard, the musician; Ute DeVargas, brilliant young soprano from Milano making her American debut in Rochester, as Mimi, maker of embroidery; Eileen Shelle, rising star on the American opera scene, as Musetta, Marcello's girl friend; and Ronald Combs, member of the University of Wisconsin faculty, in the dual role of Benoit, the landlord, and Alcindoro.

"La Boheme" will be conducted by Maestro Anton Guadagno, music director of the Philadelphia Lyric Opera Co. who is considered to have one of the most exciting batons and prolific careers in all music.
