Declaring that abortion, as bad as it is, is only the "first step in progression toward the dehumanization of human life," Sen. Donovan cited some of the research going on now, such as wombs, synthetic sperm, genetic manipulation and creation of life itself. He characterized such

class alienated, the "middle Americans," and the minority groups.

The hippies, the dropouts and the counter-culture, said Msgr. Baroni, have rejected the American life style as meaningless; the majority groups are struggling to adopt it; and the "middle Americans," watching these other two "children of the American family" monopolizing the media, have come to realize that they are trapped and have "no options."

While in Rochester, Msgr. Baroni met with seminarians from St. Bernard's and priests from urban parishes on Monday morning at St. Anthony of Padua; in the afternoon, he talked with local professional social workers.

The son of an immigrant coal-miner, Msgr. Baroni was ordained in 1956 in the Pennsylvania diocese of Altoona-Johnstown.

After leave to study in Washington, he became Cardinal Patrick O'Boyle's human relations chief.

His present job with the U.S. Catholic Conference grew out of his Washington experience.

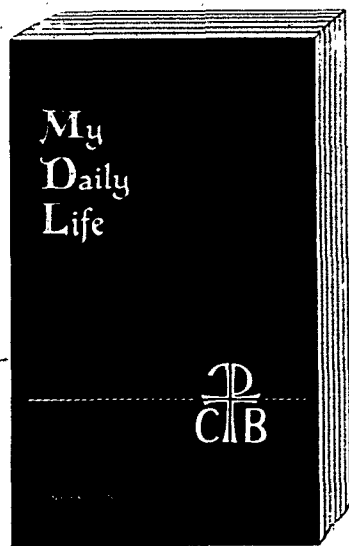
"Celibacy is not a problem for monks. You know when you enter what is required of you. Being a monk is a very satisfying life, but one must be prepared to make sacrifices."

He criticized the media for sensationalizing recent church changes, pointing out that a married clergy existed in the early church until the 12th century.

"It is necessary to remind people," Father Fabian said, "that recent changes, like Mass facing the people, are not new developments, they are the cycle of history going around."
