The famous song will rise in Notre Dame High School when the University of Notre Dame Glee Club performs here Nov. 23.

The "Voice of the Fighting Irish, under the direction of Professor Daniel H. Pedtke, will be heard at 2:15 and 8:15 p.m.

Professor Pedtke has been in charge of the glee club since 1938. He is known as a composer, director and music teacher. The glee club goes back to 1915 when 12 students at the university organized an informal songfest. Since that time the club has become known through radio, television and personal appearances across the country. The 40 club members travel more than 9,000 miles a year filling concert engagements.

Ticket price for the afternoon performance is \$1, while the evening event is listed at \$2. The program is under the sponsorship of the Notre Dame High School Musical Benefit Association.

The ball will be held November 27 from 9:30 p.m. to 1:30 a.m. in the main ballroom of the Mark Twain Hotel. Music for the affair will be provided by the Mark Terry Orchestra.

Horizon House is an informational and recreational center for all Chemung County senior citizens. The house at Park Place and W. Clinton Street, is open to all denominations, but 60 years is the minimum age.

Co-chairmen of the ball are Mrs. Paul Donovan and Mrs. Frank Belligotti. Tickets may be purchased in advance at Horizon House or from any member of the Ladies of Charity, at \$10 per couple.

## Dignity of Life Service Planned

Elmira — The Elmira Right to Life Committee will sponsor "A Prayerful Reflection on the Dignity of Life" Saturday from 2 until 4 p.m. in the Interfaith Chapel at St. John's Hospital.

The ecumenical prayer service, open to all, will consist of scripture readings regarding the sanctity of life, a film, singing by the Celebrate Life group, a shared homily prayer and reflection.

A spokesman for the Right to Life Committee said the service is planned "as a positive, prayerful reaction to anti-life forces at work in the nation."

"One such group is the Women's National Abortion Activity Action Coalition. Mass demonstrations, demanding repeal of all abortion laws and 'restrictive contraception laws', are planned for Saturday in Washington, D.C. and San Francisco."
