' Things sure are mixed up.

While Catholic schools in Section 5 (Rochester) of the New York State Public High School Athletic Association are scrambling to join the section, their Catholic cousins in Section 3 (Syracuse) and Section 4 (Southern Tier) have already received permission by those sections to join — in a two year experimental program which entitles them to full participation in all post season sectional tournaments.

Meanwhile Catholic schools in Section 6 (Buffalo) have decided not to participate in the 1972 Section 6 basketball tournament playoffs.

While Section 5 finds the Catholics knocking at its door for membership, the Msgr. Martin Catholic High School Athletic Association (the Buffalo Catholic league) turned down a presentation made to them by Section 6 president Daniel P. Hagen whereby it was proposed that the 18-team Catholic circuit join the 88member public school group.

The feeling of the Catholic League in Buffalo isn't as complicated as the situation in Section 5. The Buffalo Catholics thought it was too late to rearrange the already completed basketball schedule in order to insert its league into the Section 6 playoffs.

Whether an agreement can be reached for spring sports is now being studied by the Buffalo Catholic League.

Section 5 members vote on the Catholic question through the mail and the results should be known on or about Friday,



Missionary to China Slates Talks in Area

Elmira — The founder of the Legion of Mary in the People's Republic of China, Father Aedan McGrath, will spend the weekend in Elmira, Hornell and Waverly, speaking on his work in China. Open and closed Legion of Mary meetings at three different parishes are planned.

The Irish Columban priest was held in solitary confinement in China for almost three vears. He had arrived in the country in 1948, charged with the responsibility of forming Legion groups.

The priest's arrival in the Far East occurred just as the Communists were launching their full scale takeover of the country. Father McGrath was one of a few Catholic Church leaders to survive this upheaval.
