# Cuban Missioner Visits Auburn Area

Auburn — The fact Catholic schools in Guatemala are not tax exempt was an interesting note made by Marist Brother Angel Carrodeganas in a brief interview during his recent visit with relatives in Auburn.

A native Cuban, he studied in Spain. A psychology major, he has taught in Spain and El Salvador. Now he is principal of a 900-student, all boys high school in Guatemala City, Guatemala, which also operates a 300-student evening division for boys ages 12 to 20.

Although a full-time administrator, he is a teacher at heart and feels teachers in Guatemala can be more personally influential in the lives of students, that youth can be reached through educational influences.

Brother Angel explained that in South America, where education is not always taken for granted, his high school is supported through tuition, and is attended by the more affluent.

The Marist brothers include non-paying and partial-paying students to further integration. Experience has taught them that to give services away is not the answer, and they encourage as much self-contribution as possible.

Although there are no longer Marist institutions in Cuba where he may be assigned, he states he still feels like a Cuban.
