

College Life Seen Incomplete Without Religious Dimension

Ithaca — Father Phillip J. Lioi, Catholic chaplain at Ithaca College, sees the college experience as a break from home, a transition to complete independence, a way into a profession, even, sometimes, a four-year vacation. In any case, he says, when a student wants to expand his knowledge, living experience and consciousness, the depth of the religious dimension cannot be blanked out.

Ithaca College has three chaplains to articulate their respective theologies to the students, as well as develop an interfaith spirit among themselves. Housed under the common roof of Rowland Hall are Father Lioi, The Rev. George Clarkson, Protestant chaplain, and Rabbi Morris Goldfarb. It was announced recently that they will provide a Sunday morning radio program to be aired on WICB, the campus station. The three chaplains will take their turns hosting the half-hour programs.

The United Christian Fellowship, the largest religious community at Ithaca College with approximately 1,400 declared members, is the co-ordinating group for Protestant work on campus. Its administrative body, the UCF Council, is composed of students, faculty and area clergymen. Mr. Clarkson is assisted occasionally by the Rev. Ted Jones, the Episcopal curate.

A breakdown of the membership finds about 400 "general" Protestants, 220 Episcopalians, 30 Unitarians, 20 Greek Orthodox, 60 Baptists, 100 Lutherans, 220 Presbyterians, and 230 Methodists for the 1971-72 school year. These various denominations are provided with

Kilkenny, Ireland (RNS) — Roman Catholic Bishop Peter Birch of Ossory, Kilkenny, has called for a Christmas truce in the sectarian conflict in Northern Ireland.

"All of us should ask for — even demand — a Christmas truce," he said in a sermon in St. Mary's Cathedral here, "and once a lull is secured, and the raiding and the killing and the fear has stopped, people could then begin to reflect and talk, instead of fighting."

The goal of Ithaca College Hillel, which has a membership of about 100 students, is to perpetuate Judaism on campus through the furthering of Jewish religion, heritage and culture.
