Roric Harrison Joins CYO Staff

Roric Harrison, recently named "International League right handed pitcher of the year," has signed on with the Rochester CYO, on a part-time basis. Paul B. Schmidt, executive director of the organization, announced last week.

Harrison, described by Red Wings' general manager Carl Steinfeldt as "one of the key reasons we won the pennant last year," will work in CYO sports classes and the CYO bus-mobile program until he reports for Spring Training in Miami for the Baltimore Orioles.

Harrison's record last year was 15 wins, five losses with five shutouts. He struck out 182 batters in 170 innings. He also recently completed required studies for a sociology degree from Arizona State University.
