Area Churches Revise Teen Religion Program

Ithaca — At the end of its first term of operation, the religious education program of the Ithaca area churches is in for some changes. They were the principal topic for discussion at a meeting of program staff members held at Immaculate Conception Dec. 22.

The ecumenical undertaking, dubbed the "Tin Can Teen Program", after the Stewart Park building in which it was held, was launched at the beginning of the school year under the sponsorship of the Congregational, Lutheran, Methodist, Catholic, and Presbyterian churches. It has encountered a number of difficulties. The "Tin Can" itself was ruined by fire. Attendance at the weekly programs, after leveling at an average of about 160 high school age youth, dropped sharply in the wake of the fire when meetings shifted to Immaculate Conception.

Another problem grew out of complaints that the program lacked structure, a feature designed into it in an effort to

make it attractive to the young people. Some staff members indicated it was difficult to establish continuity in their presentations when it was uncertain which students would attend given programs each week. A number of parents showed concern over the general absence of a closely supervised training organization. Finally, some of the program topics originally offered failed for lack of interest in their subject matter.

Some positive signs emerged, however, through a survey of students attending the sessions. While approximately 50 percent stated that they came in part because their parents required them to do so, the overwhelming majority also indicated they would attend even if not required. The individual weekly presentations, including those which were rather sparse attended, received favorable evaluations from teenagers taking part in them. Most felt they

were both interesting and provocative.

In an attempt to strengthen the program's weaknesses and capitalize on favorable reactions, changes are being introduced for the spring term that begins February 7. Msgr. William Roche, pastor of St. Catherine's, has assumed responsibility for administration. The educational staff will be enlarged. Additional program offerings of interest will be actively sought. Students will share the responsibility for working out in advance the direction their group will move from week to week. An organized weekly social hour will be developed. Finally, in an attempt to broaden participation, an enhanced campaign of publicity for the program will be launched.

Nazareth to Get State Aid

Nazareth College of Rochester, denied state aid in 1969, has qualified for assistance for this academic year and will receive \$133,200 under the so-called Bundy program.

Nazareth was one of seven colleges of religious background that Education Commissioner Ewald B. Nyquist found eligible. He said that "none of them is any longer under the control or direction of a religious denomination or teaches denominational tenets or doctrine."

Among the private institutions that failed in their first bid for Bundy funds but succeeded this time are the College of New Rochelle, Rosary Hill in Buffalo, St. Rose in Albany and Manhattan College in New York City.

The education department's announcement said they had qualified by "making various changes in such areas as programs, course requirements, administration and descriptive documents and publications."

Aid is computed on the basis of \$400 for each bachelor's and master's degree and \$2,400 for each doctorate awarded in the 12 months ending June 30.
