

#### **Church on Wheels**

Ireland's first church on wheels — complete with pulpit and fold-away spire — is bringing religion to the people. The "Churchmobile," a bus which has been painted to resemble a Gothic church on the outside, seats 40 people. The unique vehicle is the answer to the problem of dwindling congregations in a large area faced by a County Kildare Baptist minister, the Rev. Robert Dunlop. Mr. Dunlop, pastor in the Irish Midlands, will use the churchmobile for traditional services and for informal meetings.

# Ulster Extends Parade Ban

Belfast, Northern Ireland — (RNS) — Prime Minister Brian Faulkner has ordered a one-year ban on all parades in the strife-torn British province.

The ban affects traditional Catholic parades at Easter as well as the later Protestant Apprentice Boys' Parade and the July 12 Orange Day parade—a key symbol of Protestant control in Northern Ireland.

Faulkner's announcement came after meetings between government officials and the British Army. Military officers felt that the frequently "provocative" parades, with Protestants marching by Roman Catholic areas could spur further violence in the already tense province.

The Orange Day parade—the biggest of the year in Ulster—celebrates the victory of Protestant William of Orange over Roman Catholic King James II in the battle of the Boyne in 1690. The smaller Apprentice Boys' parade is connected with the same event.

An earlier six-month ban on

parades was due to expire in February.

In announcing the extension on the ban, Faulkner pointed out that during World War II "there were no marches, there were no Orange celebrations. The risk now to life and limb is possibly greater than it was then," he said.

errors have caused the Catholic Church to maintain a "rigorous conservation of authentic revelation" which, he said must be considered as "an inviolable treasure to be defended and transmitted in unequivocal terms."

"The master Church does not invent her doctrine," he declared. "She is the witness and custodian, the interpreter and the messenger. And as far as the proper truths of the Chris-

tian message are concerned she can be called conservative and intransigent."

The pontiff said that theological pluralism is legitimate when it is held within the sphere of the faith and magisterium. He added that the "Word of God, guarded in its authenticity, cannot be arid and sterile but only fertile and living and destined not only to be listened to . . but lived . . in individual souls, individual communities, in dividual churches
