Bath — "We'll be looking for 200 pints," declared Ted Fithian of Bath, blood chairman for the Northern Steuben Chapter

American Red Cross, as he noted that a blood drive will be held in Bath at the Centenary United Methodist Church Thursday, Jan. 27, from noon to 6 p.m. "Our quota is 125 units but we would really like to hit 200," he stated.

Sponsoring this month's effort will be the Precious Blood Council of the Knights of Columbus. "It's a statewide effort by our organization for the three weeks beginning Jan. 23," observed Grand Knight Shirley Baxter, who noted that the backing of the bank was approved by the local membership last week.

In a letter from Philip J. Sparo, director of council activities for the state Knights of Columbus, to the local council, it was requested that the unit "show that you are a community-minded organization" by sponsoring a blood drive during the stated period.
