Teen League members in Rochester Area Catholic and public high schools are sponsoring an education campaign on the problems in West Bengal, India and Bangla Desh. Teen spokesmen said the campaign will culminate in a Hunger Day, to be held Wednesday, Feb. 9 to raise money for refugees in these countries.

Students have been asked by Teen League to donate their lunch money on Hunger Day to the cause of refugee relief.

All money collected during the campaign will go to OX-FAM — America, whose local chapter is Rochester Concern for East Bengal. OXFAM op-erates six camps for refugee 'relief.

James Eckberg, a senior at Penfield High School, is chair-man of the campaign. He re-cently commented that he hopes the drive will collect \$10,000 \$10,000.

Teen League is a county wide organization of high school students, widely known as the sponsor of Hike for HOPE, which last year raised over \$600,000 for the hospital ship HOPE and other charitable organizations.
