Hornell Area Notes

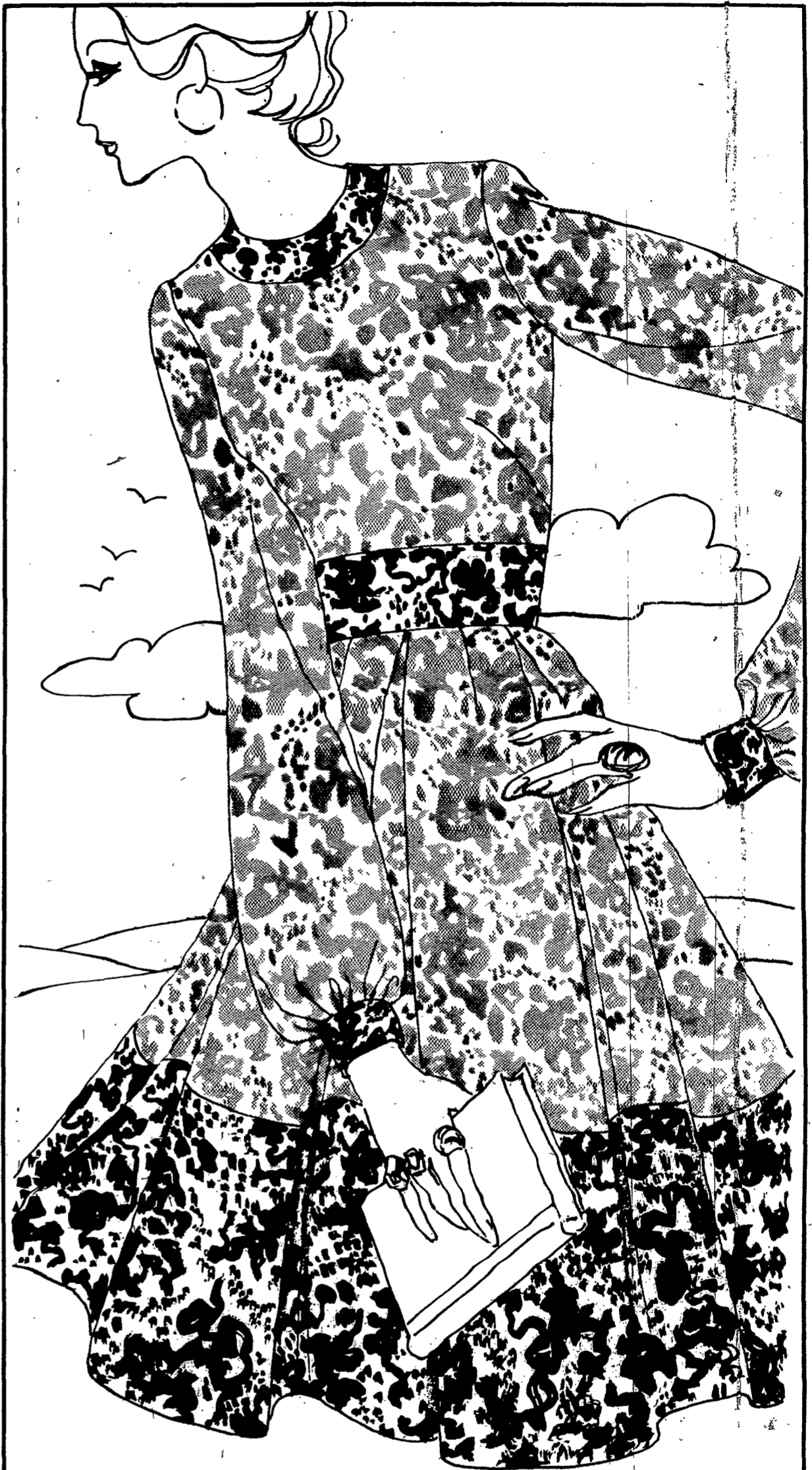
