How do City-Catholic swim times compare with the best state time this year?

Judge for yourself; the following best state times were supplied by Vestal High principal Roger Bell (who is also the state swimming chairman) in conjunction with the New York State Sports Writers Association.

We'll take the recent McQuaid win over East, 63-32, to base our C-C times on. That win was McQuaid's 17th straight C-C victory although Knights have lost to some county schools, notably Greece Olympia.

East did win a couple of events in its loss to McQuaid. We'll just list the winning times from the McQuaid-East meet but we'll give you the full treatment on the best state time, name and school, as of 1/27.
