Residents of Murray Hall, above, exult as a forfeit by Ward Hall's fifth floor team gives them a victory in the football playoffs.

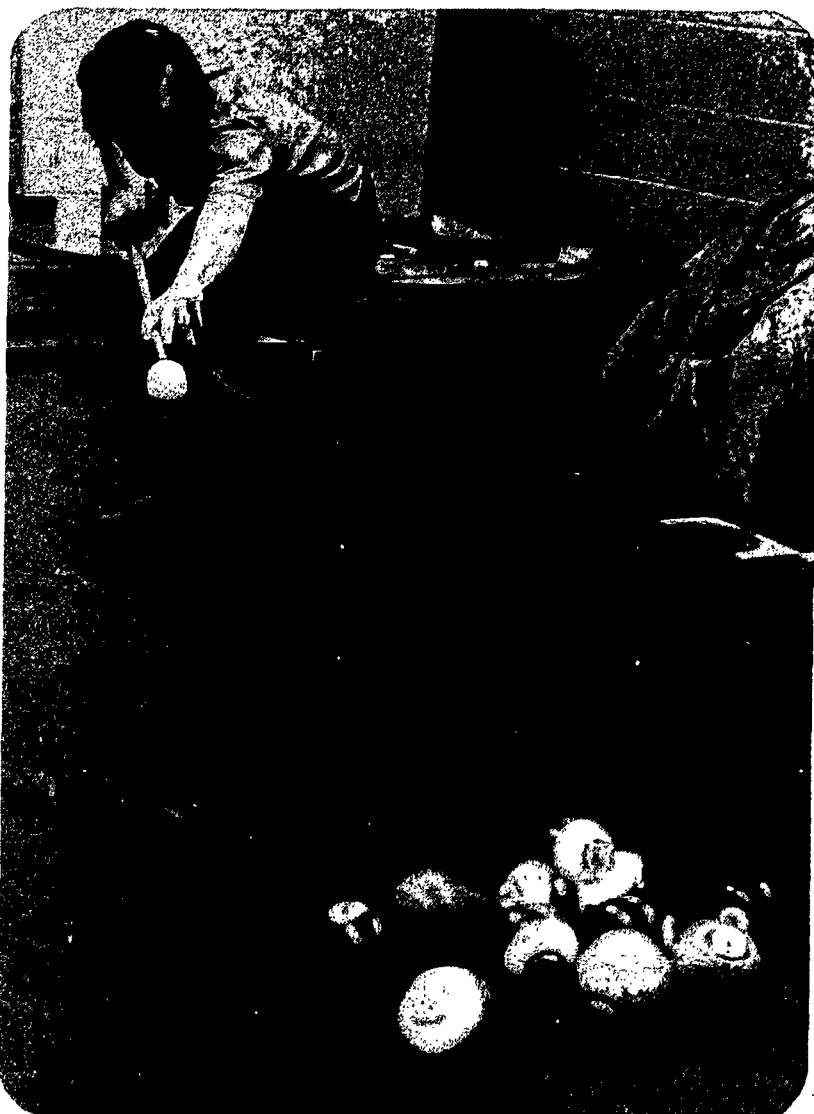
Art DeHay, right, also of Murray Hall, concentrates on the game of pool that gave his team victory over Ward Hall's second floor.
