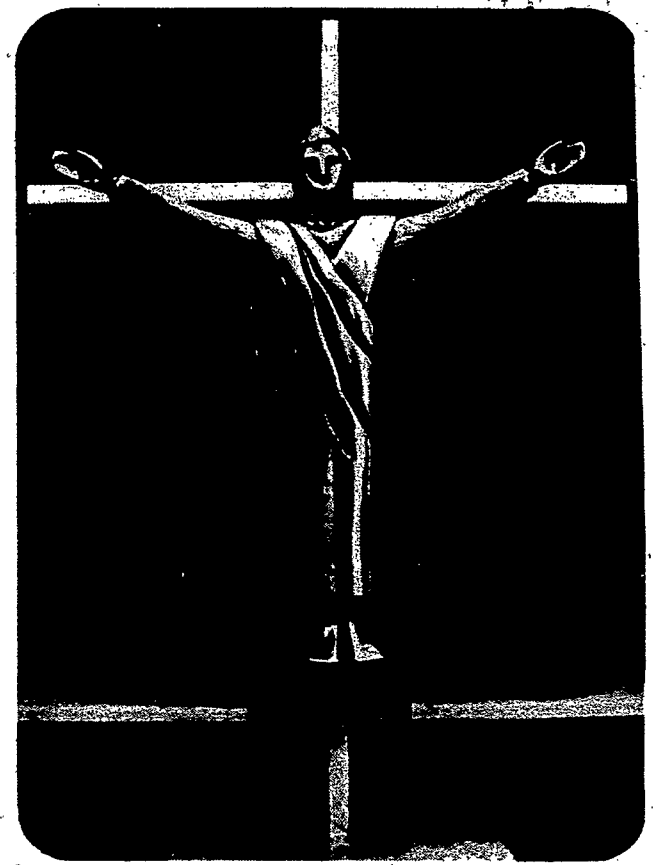

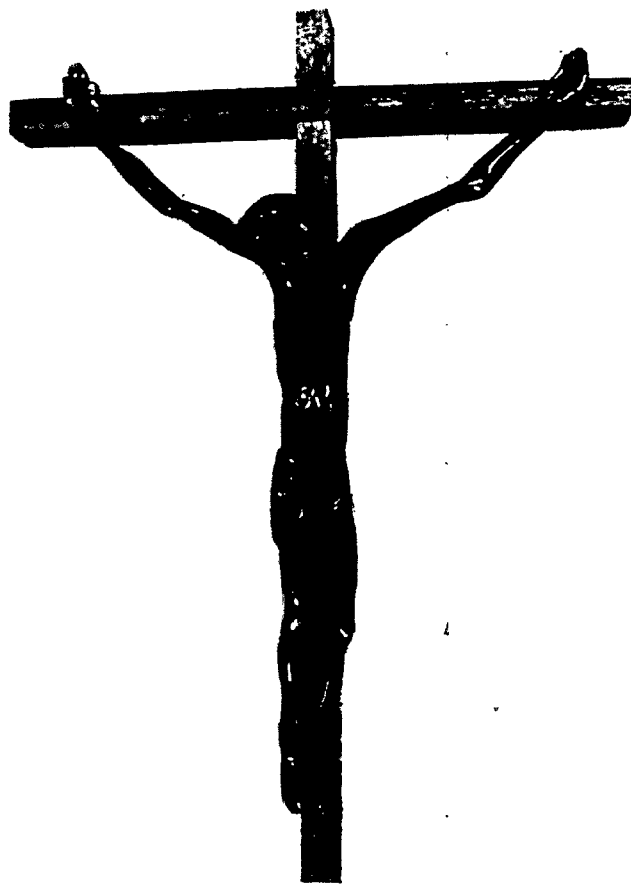

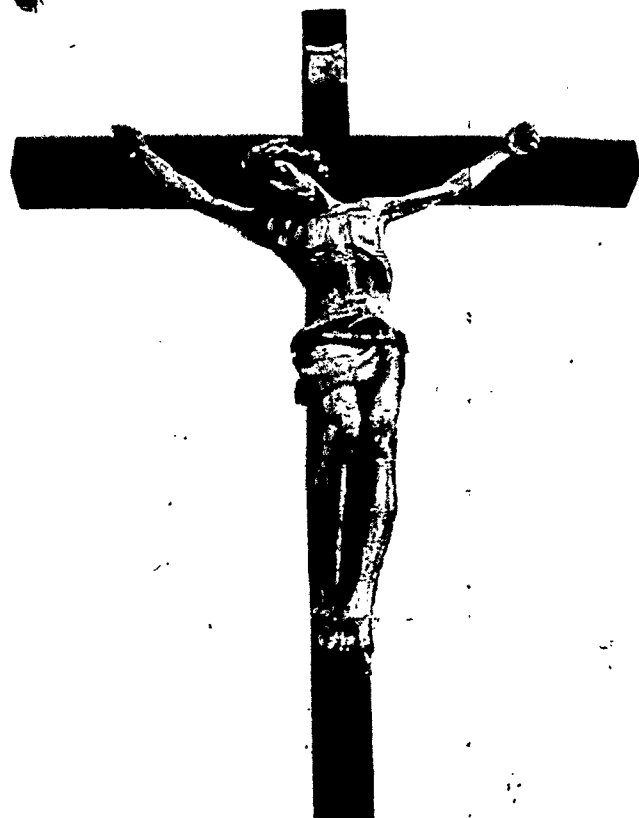


ALTAR CRUCIFIX

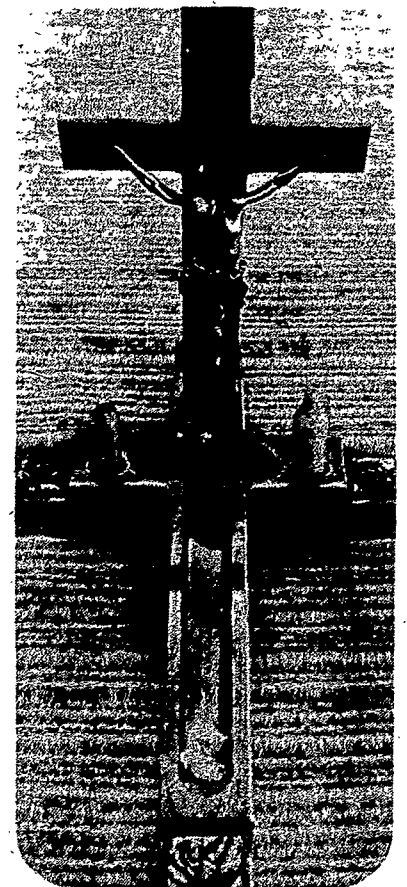
