## Pre-Cana Conference

The Pre-Cana Conference is a series of talks for the purpose of preparing young engaged couples for marriage. In these talks engaged couples have an opportunity to examine their love for one another in the light of the reality of married life.

The Pre-Cana staff discuss this reality in terms of their own experience<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> the priest relating his knowledge of spiritual and sacramental aspects of matrimony, the married couples relating secrets of success in marital communication, adjustment, coping with problems, etc., the physician relating physical, psysiological, and psychological information important for married people.

The Pre-Cana Conference is a supplement to the instructions given to the engaged couple by their parish priest.

This program is open to all interested couples preparing for marriage. Couples entering an interfaith marriage are welcome at all conferences. Special

information regarding interfaith marriage is given at every conference.

There is a registration fee of \$5.00 per couple to defray necessary expenses of the program.

A certificate of attendance is given to those who attend the conference. The certificate is to be shown to the parish priest when final arrangements are made for the wedding.

Father Robert Collins, diocesan director of the Family Life Office, said the parish priest should be consulted for dates, places and times of the conferences, which are held throughout ' the year.

But they won't be so happy if you sign it on checks before registering your new signature. It only takes a couple of minutes; do it, then relax.


Also remember to:
