St. Stanislaus Holds Special Mass

The spirit and the unity felt at this special Mass came from preparation which the students had done long before actually gathering in the gym.

The words of Jesus hung on bright banners made by students and chairs were arranged according to classes in a semi-circle around the altar. Readings were chosen and proclaimed by students. And one eighth grade girl actually became an altar "girl", helping a classmate serve the celebrant, Father William Pietrzykowski, associate pastor.

The hymns were chosen by students and they were, as one student said, "not at all old fashioned." Guitars supported the singing of the last hymn, "Let it be", and when asked whether there should be more of these school Masses. Students would answer "let it be!"

This Mass and other projects, such as the painting and carpeting of a prayer room by the eighth grade, have been facilitated by a religion program which includes the help of three diocesan seminarians: Matthew Kawiak, Bill Newman, and Michael Schramel. Once a week

they help the teachers with such events as this Mass. As one sixth grade student said after the celebration, "It makes me feel proud of my school!"
