clergy. And it is ridiculous for us to talk of priorities again when we have come to grips with them before.

Father Cocuzzi explained that the bishop wanted them to review the matter, but did not mean to direct their vote. He tried to encourage them to consider the basic question, "do we accept Father Moynihan's financial assessment.

The underlying implication, as the council saw it, was that the power and the responsibility of the council was being questioned.

Father Brennan said, "I don't think we can let the implication stand that we do not represent the clergy of Rochester. If that is the case we should dissolve ourselves.'

A vote reaffirmed all previously established priorities and it was decided to hold an open




