# St. Patrick's Up to Date

**Courier-Journal correspondent** Mary Ann Ginnerty is doing a series of stories on Auburn area parochial schools.

Seneca Falls - St. Patrick(s School in Seneca Falls, with an anticipated September enrollment of 358 in kindergarten through grade 8, includes four members of the Sisters of St. Joseph on its staff of 20. Sister Eileen Regina is principal.

Sister Eileen Regina explained departmentalization in grades 5 through 8 has been in effect for the past three years, with cooperative teaching introduced at the 4th grade level this year.

Under departmentalization, she feels, teachers instruct the subject in which they are most qualified. Teachers don't need to spend as much time planning material in several areas. Materials and equipment can be more centralized and a more complete instructional center built up.

Sister also feels student exposure to different teachers is preparation for the upper grades.

The greatest recent growth in programming is occurring in the reading approach with the introduction of the Scott Foresman Reading System in kindergarten and grade 1. This approach will be expanded another grade in the fall.

This system permits each child to progress through readers at his own speed. Under this system. individualized letters are sent home to parents to advise them of their child's progress.

The school also has two remedial reading teachers for the primary grades.

Another area of growth in-cludes the combined library and learning center facility staffed by a full time librarian. A school library memorial fund permits frequent library additions.


Primary grade children participate in weekly story hours and how to use the library sessions. Five sets permit integration of educational television into the program.

Services of a psychiatric consultant are available.

There is a full time gym program, with extra curriculum activities including basketball and intramural volleyball.

St. Patrick's has a junior high glee club under the direction of Mrs. John Reardon, and Sister St. Benedict's "Up With St. Patrick's People' group performs locally.

Two women volunteers assist in the art program, 13 in the library, and mechanical drawing is available one evening a week for junior high students.
