Rehabilitation Unit Memoralizes Sullivan

Elmira — The Board of Directors at St. Joseph's Hospital will hold formal dedication ceremonies May 7 of the John E. Sullivan Rehabilitation. Pavilion. The pavilion will house the hospital's new Southern Tier Institute of Rehabilitation.

Mr. Sullivan was chairman of the hospital's board of directors from 1937 until his death in 1965. He was a lawyer and businessman who devoted considerable time to civic and charitable causes. He also gained recognition in local sports and political circles.

The dedication program will include addresses by Dr. Arthur S. Abramson, president of the American Academy of Physical Medicine and Rehabilitation, professional golfer Arnold Palmer, and Bishop Joseph L. Hogan

In announcing the dedication, Charles F. Kennedy, current board chairman, said, "We have been waiting for that significant moment in the history of St. Joseph's Hospital in which to memorialize a man whose life was St. Joseph's Hospital. That moment has come with the completion of the Southern Tier Institute of Rehabilitation."

Mr Sullivan was a trustee of Cornell University, president of the Chemung County Bar Association, a member of the Volunteers of America, the 1952 campaign director for the Community Chest, a director of the Chemung Canal Trust Company, and a four-time president of the Elmira Country Club.

His widow, the former Lorana Olcott of Big Flats, and their son, John E. Sullivan Jr., live in Elmira. A daughter, Lorana, is on the staff of the Wall Street Journal in London, England.


