Official Lauds X-Ray School

Hornell—The School of X-Ray Technology of St. James Mercy Hospital has maintained the standards set forth by the Bureau of X-Ray Technology, State Department of Health, and the school's registration has been extended.

In a letter received by Dr. William J. MacFarland, radiologist director of the school, Howard L. Goldman, LXT, director of the bureau, stated: "We have received favorable reports from our consultants, on their visit to the School of Radiologic Technology at St. James Mercy Hospital on March 28. The consultants report that most of the recommendations made by this department have been followed and that there have been a number of improvements.

'Among many other favorable observations, the consultants noted that the school is now in, its own quarters with what one of the consultants describes as 'The nicest arrangement I have ever seen.' They also noted approvingly the number of teaching aids, including an xray simulator. They reported that formal film critique sessions are being held weekly by Dr. MacFarland, in addition to informal sessions in which instructors evaluate and grade each case. The library has been strengthened and the school has comprehensive course out-lines and lesson plans and very adequate student records.

"On the basis of these findings, we are extending regular registration to the school.

"We would like also to congratulate your school for the very good performance of its students in the licensing examinations since 1968. We note that none of your students even came close to failing, and that a number did exceptionally well."
