Home - School Unit Hears Drug Abuse Talk

Canandaigua — Paul Furdock, senior investigator in charge of the Narcotic Division for the State Police here, spoke to parents at St. Mary's School last week.

Using his sample case containing all kinds of narcotics as well as syringes, pipes and other such equipment, Furdock touched on the use and abuse of drugs in the area.

He explained drug raids, undercover work, drug abuse laws, and the relationship

between drug users and long hair —there is none, Furdock pointed out.

Asked what a parent should do if he learns his child is using narcotics, Furdock suggested a talk with the child. He also pointed out that a good source of counseling often is found in priests or ministers.

Open to the public, the meeting was sponsored by the St. Mary's Home School Association.
