## Nazareth Hall To Graduate First Girl Pupil

Heather Fisk will graduate from Nazareth Hall June 19. If that sounds strange it is because she will be the first girl ever to graduate from the former military school.

Heather came to Nazareth at the beginning of April from Charlotte Junior High. She says that one of the big differences at Nazareth is that "now I stand at the front of the lines."

She says that the boys have been very polite to her. "They treat me different from everybody else, I guess because I'm a girl."

There are 25 other girls at Nazareth Hall. The school has accepted girls for the past two years, as part of the school's overhaul from a Catholic military school to a private, Catholic, co-educational school.

Sister Mary Joan, SSJ, Nazareth Hall's principal, said, "We have a magnificent set-up here. There are 138 students, and classes are limited to about 20 students each. We are different from other schools in that we are more structured and quieter."

"Yet there is no fear element here," Sister Joan continued. "The teachers are friendly, and the students are called Mister and Miss. We feel that there are children who need a quieter atmosphere and that is what we try to give them. Security, I think, is the key word."

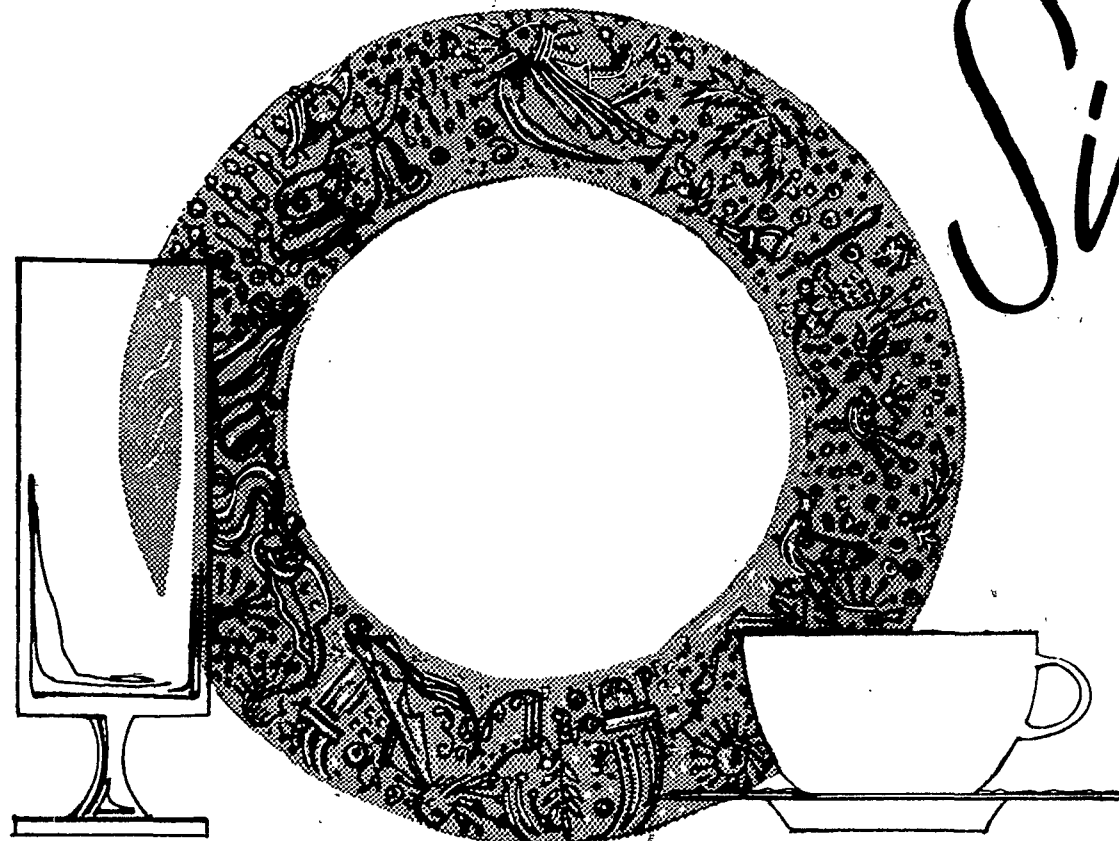

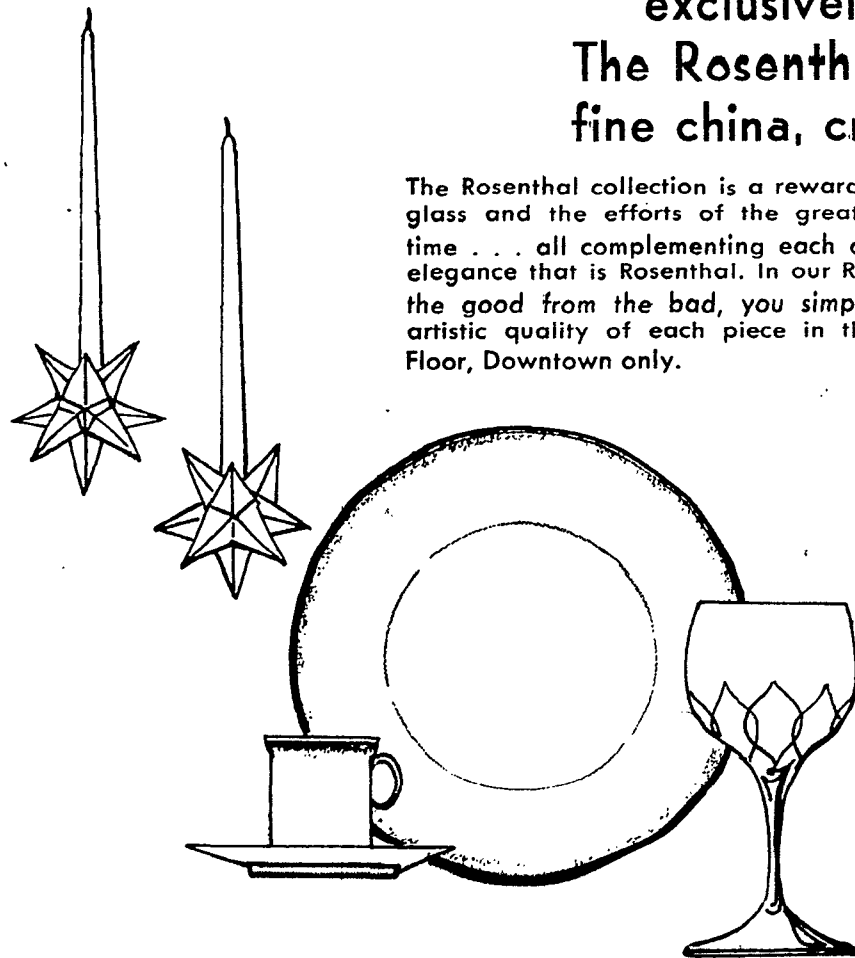
Projansky will present the fashion show and Harris Seed the flowers and plantings for the affair which will raise money to beautify East Avenue.
